

CHOOSING A CHRISTIAN NAME

There is no need to choose a separate name for Confirmation as long as the baptismal name of the Candidate is a Christian name. In fact, using the baptismal name for Confirmation is best, because it expressed the relationship that exists between Baptism and Confirmation.

If the baptismal name is not that of a recognized saint, a new name should be chosen for Confirmation. Names of saints are chosen to serve as patrons and models for those being confirmed. Candidates should choose a patron saint's name, not because of the attractiveness of the name, but because of the attractiveness of the Christian life that that person led.
