Clergy Corner - From Fr. Daniel

We are quickly approaching the celebration of Jesus's Passion, Death, and Resurrection. Hopefully, our Lenten pilgrimages up to this point have been blessed with perseverance amid failures and successes. As you noticed in the church, beginning today all of the statues and images have been covered with veils. Something different is happening. The Church fixes our attention more intently on the coming Passion of Our Lord. During Holy Week; we will listen more attentively to the Passion Narrative proclaimed from the ambo; we will walk with our Lord in procession; we will watch as all of the usual adornments of the Church are taken away just as Jesus Christ's life was taken away by His persecutors. We no longer have the comfort of these images and statues. It's only us and Jesus.

The Liturgy of Holy Thursday, in particular, possesses very powerful symbolism in every action that takes place. We gather around the altar just as the apostles gathered with Our Lord around the table on that Holy Thursday evening. The priest washes the feet of members of our parish family, just as Our Lord washed the feet of His apostles. We receive Communion, just as the apostles received Communion for the very first time on Holy Thursday. Then, we process with Our Lord and spend time in silent prayer with Him, just as the apostles followed our Lord to the Garden of Gethsemane as He prayed to His Father before He was arrested.

One of the most beautiful and sobering rituals of the entire liturgical year takes place at the end of Mass on Holy Thursday: **The Transfer of the Most Blessed Sacrament**. During this time, the hosts that will be distributed during the liturgy on Good Friday are "transferred" to another tabernacle, where they remain until the next day. Two peculiarities stand out about this ritual.

Firstly, we process to a separate location and place Our Lord in a different tabernacle than the one we normally use. Another tabernacle is set up and decorated on what is known as the "altar of repose", as the hosts remain reposed there until the Good Friday liturgy. The **altar of repose** is meant to be a symbol of the Garden of Gethsemane, so it is often decorated with flowers like one would find in a garden. The symbolism behind the procession to the altar of repose is that we literally are following Our Lord to Gethsemane, where we are invited, like the apostles, to "watch and pray" (Matthew 26:41).

Secondly, the hosts are carried in a ciborium. Indeed, the liturgical instructions are very clear: "The Blessed Sacrament should be reserved in a closed tabernacle or pyx. Under no circumstances may it be exposed in a monstrance". Especially here at Holy Spirit Parish, where Perpetual Adoration is a mainstay of our spiritual life, this instruction might seem out of place. Why do we have this very clear instruction asking us to keep Our Lord hidden from sight? We do so because we are joining ourselves to the Apostles who, after celebrating the Last Supper, walked with our Lord to the Garden of Gethsemane, stayed nearby while He prays with His Father, and then watched as He was arrested and taken away from their sight. Thus, we, too, have Our Lord taken away from our sight. As St. John tells us, Jesus was "seized", "bound", and brought before the Jewish and Roman leaders, where He suffered before being led to His death on the Cross (John 18). Likewise, Jesus is "bound" and "seized" inside the ciborium and kept in the tabernacle until we celebrate the liturgy of His Death on Good Friday. Is it sad that we can no longer look at the host in the monstrance? Yes, absolutely. But that's the point. We are supposed to be saddened by this. We are supposed to experience once again what was experienced almost 2,000 years ago. The next time that we participate in Adoration will be on Good Friday, where Jesus's Cross, His throne of victory, is unveiled. We adore the Cross of Jesus because by it, He has redeemed the world. Hail the Cross, our only hope.

Ministerio Destacado

Esta semana, queremos agradecer especialmente a todos los Cantores de nuestros coros. Son particularmente importantes, ya que no solo cantan en la Misa dominical, sino que también están siempre dispuestos cuando se les necesita para funerales, la Misa del Primer Viernes y celebraciones especiales. Les agradecemos a todos por compartir su don de la música y por ser una parte importante de nuestro Ministerio de Música y de nuestra Liturgia.

Rincón del Clero - Mensaje del Padre Daniel

Nos acercamos rápidamente a la celebración de la Pasión, Muerte y Resurrección de Jesús. Ojalá que nuestra peregrinación cuaresmal hasta este punto haya sido bendecida con perseverancia en medio de fracasos y éxitos. Como habrán notado en la iglesia, a partir de hoy, todas las estatuas e imágenes han sido cubiertas con velos. Algo diferente está ocurriendo. La Iglesia fija nuestra atención más intensamente en la próxima Pasión de Nuestro Señor. Durante la Semana Santa, escucharemos con mayor atención la Narración de la Pasión proclamada desde el ámbón; caminaremos con nuestro Señor en procesión; observaremos cómo se retiran todos los adornos habituales de la Iglesia, tal como la vida de Jesucristo fue arrebatada por Sus perseguidores. Ya no contamos con la comodidad de estas imágenes y estatuas. Solo quedamos nosotros y Jesús.

La Liturgia del Jueves Santo, en particular, posee un simbolismo muy poderoso en cada una de sus acciones. Nos reunimos alrededor del altar, tal como los apóstoles se reunieron con Nuestro Señor en la mesa aquella noche de Jueves Santo. El sacerdote lava los pies de algunos miembros de nuestra comunidad parroquial, tal como Nuestro Señor lavó los pies de Sus apóstoles. Recibimos la Comunión, tal como los apóstoles la recibieron por primera vez en el Jueves Santo. Luego, procesamos con Nuestro Señor y pasamos tiempo en oración silenciosa con Él, tal como los apóstoles siguieron a nuestro Señor al Huerto de Getsemaní mientras Él oraba a Su Padre antes de ser arrestado.

Uno de los rituales más hermosos y conmovedores de todo el año litúrgico ocurre al final de la Misa del Jueves Santo: El traslado del Santísimo Sacramento. Durante este momento, las hostias que serán distribuidas en la liturgia del Viernes Santo son trasladadas a otro sagrario, donde permanecerán hasta el día siguiente. Dos peculiaridades destacan en este rito.

En primer lugar, procesamos a un lugar separado y colocamos a Nuestro Señor en un tabernáculo diferente al que usamos normalmente. Se prepara y adorna otro tabernáculo en lo que se conoce como el "altar de la reserva", donde las hostias permanecen reservadas hasta la liturgia del Viernes Santo. El altar de la reserva está destinado a ser un símbolo del Huerto de Getsemaní, por lo que a menudo se adorna con flores, como las que encontraríamos en un jardín. El simbolismo detrás de la procesión al altar de la reserva es que literalmente seguimos a Nuestro Señor hasta Getsemaní, donde se nos invita, como a los apóstoles, a "velar y orar" (Mateo 26,41).

En segundo lugar, las hostias son llevadas en un copón. De hecho, las instrucciones litúrgicas son muy claras: "El Santísimo Sacramento debe reservarse en un sagrario cerrado o en una píxide. Bajo ninguna circunstancia puede exponerse en una custodia". Especialmente aquí, en la Parroquia del Espíritu Santo, donde la Adoración Perpetua es un pilar de nuestra vida espiritual, esta instrucción puede parecer extraña. ¿Por qué esta indicación tan clara de mantener a Nuestro Señor oculto a la vista? Lo hacemos porque nos unimos a los Apóstoles, quienes, después de celebrar la Última Cena, caminaron con nuestro Señor hasta el Huerto de Getsemaní, permanecieron cerca mientras Él oraba a Su Padre y luego vieron cómo fue arrestado y apartado de su vista. Del mismo modo, nosotros también vemos a Nuestro Señor ser retirado de nuestra vista. Como nos dice San Juan, Jesús fue "apresado", "atado" y llevado ante las autoridades judías y romanas, donde sufrió antes de ser conducido a Su muerte en la Cruz (Juan 18). Asimismo, Jesús es "atado" y "aprisionado" dentro del copón y guardado en el sagrario hasta que celebremos la liturgia de Su Muerte el Viernes Santo. ¿Es triste que ya no podamos mirar la hostia en la custodia? Sí, absolutamente. Pero ese es el propósito. Se supone que debemos entristecernos por esto. Se supone que debemos experimentar una vez más lo que se vivió hace casi 2,000 años. La próxima vez que participemos en la Adoración será en el Viernes Santo, cuando la Cruz de Jesús, Su trono de victoria, sea revelada. Adoramos la Cruz de Jesús porque por ella Él ha redimido al mundo. ¡Salve, oh Cruz, nuestra única esperanza!
