Clergy Corner - From Fr. Daniel

This week, we delve into those elements that help us join in the fullest participation of the celebration of Christ's Death and Resurrection: the reception of Holy Communion.

After the **Great Amen**, all stand to recite the **Our Father**. When asked by His disciples how to pray, Jesus offers them the Our Father as the perfect model. The last line of the Our Father ("but deliver us from evil") is then expounded upon by the Priest, who continues to invoke the Lord's protection from all sin until He comes again. Then, the people offer a brief prayer of praise, a doxology, in saying together "For the Kingdom, and the power..." It has been a longstanding custom in Jewish and Christian spirituality to end prayers with an extra line or two of praise. Thus, inserting a doxology after the Our Father has always been a common practice.

Next follows the **Rite of Peace**, in which the Priest asks God to send His peace upon the Church and then invites the congregation to offer a sign of peace to those nearest them. The sign of peace is meant to help us prepare to receive Communion. In a sense, if I look around and encounter someone with whom I share resentment instead of peace, then I do not have true Communion with that person. Since we are all receiving the One Body of Christ, we are called to be in Communion with those who share this One Body with us.

The congregation then joins together in singing the **Lamb of God**, which is accompanying an often-overlooked part of the Mass: the Fraction Rite. The priest breaks his host and places a small particle in his chalice, symbolizing the unity of the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Our Lord. Then, he breaks his host again into larger pieces to share with the congregation. In the earliest days of the Church, the Pope would send a deacon share parts of the host used during his Mass with the local parishes in Rome, signifying the unity of worship they shared. Likewise, I also distribute part of the host I used during Mass with the congregation.

The Priest will then elevate the host and invite all gathered who profess the same **Faith to the Heavenly Banquet of Christ**. Then, the priest receives Communion, followed by the congregation. The minister of Communion shows the host to those who come forward to receive and says, "The Body of Christ", to which the faithful respond "Amen", which is an affirmation of their belief that the host is truly the Body of Christ. The minister is instructed not to use individual names at this moment ("The Body of Christ, Daniel", for example), because what is being highlighted at this moment is not our individuality but rather the unity in which we all partake by virtue of being members of the Body of Christ. At that point, we, as pious custom reminds us, become a living tabernacle. For this reason, after receiving Communion, we don't bow or genuflect to the tabernacle—we carry within ourselves the God whom we adore.

Having been nourished by Jesus Himself, the Priest will offer the **Prayer After Communion**, which summarizes our Sunday prayer and asks that the Eucharist we have received bear abundant fruits in our lives. Then, the Priest blesses the congregation, and all are invited to make Jesus Christ present in the world beyond the doors of our parish church. Thus, the final act of the Mass is a reminder that our Faith is never something private or hidden but rather is meant to nourish us to be beacons of hope in a world that so longs for hope.

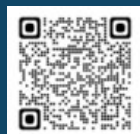

Ministry Highlight

The Mass celebrated by Bishop Raica in honor of Fr. Mike's retirement, and in thanksgiving for his years of dedicated service, was a beautiful tribute to his priestly ministry. In attendance were members of Fr. Mike's family who traveled from Ireland, along with several priests, deacons, religious, and parishioners from Holy Spirit Parish and other communities where he had served. Following the Mass, a reception was held where attendees gathered to celebrate Fr. Mike and express their gratitude for his strong commitment to the Church and our Parish.



Ministerio Destacado

La Misa celebrada por el Obispo Raica en honor al Padre Mike por su jubilación, y en acción de gracias por sus años de servicio, fue un hermoso tributo a su ministerio sacerdotal. Estuvieron presentes miembros de su familia que viajaron desde Irlanda, así como varios sacerdotes, diáconos, religiosas, y feligreses de la Parroquia Holy Spirit y otras comunidades donde él había servido. Después de la Misa, se llevó a cabo una recepción en la que los asistentes se reunieron para celebrar al Padre Mike y agradecerle por su gran compromiso con la Iglesia y nuestra Parroquia.

Rincón del Clero - Mensaje del Padre Daniel

Esta semana, profundizamos en aquellos elementos que nos ayudan a participar plenamente en la celebración de la Muerte y Resurrección de Cristo: la recepción de la Sagrada Comunión.

Después del **Gran Amén**, todos se ponen de pie para recitar el **Padre Nuestro**. Cuando sus discípulos le preguntaron cómo debían orar, Jesús les ofreció el Padre Nuestro como modelo perfecto. La última línea del Padre Nuestro ("líbranos del mal") es luego ampliada por el sacerdote, quien continúa invocando la protección del Señor contra todo pecado hasta que Él vuelva. Después, el pueblo ofrece una breve oración de alabanza, una doxología, al decir juntos: "Tuyo es el Reino, tuyo el poder...". Ha sido una costumbre antigua tanto en la espiritualidad judía como en la cristiana el concluir las oraciones con una o dos líneas adicionales de alabanza. Así, insertar una doxología después del Padre Nuestro ha sido siempre una práctica común.

Luego sigue el **Rito de la Paz**, en el cual el sacerdote pide a Dios que envíe su paz sobre la Iglesia y después invita a la asamblea a ofrecerse un signo de paz entre los más cercanos. El signo de paz está destinado a ayudarnos a prepararnos para recibir la Comunión. En cierto sentido, si al mirar a mi alrededor encuentro a alguien con quien comparto resentimiento en lugar de paz, entonces no tengo verdadera Comunión con esa persona. Ya que todos vamos a recibir el único Cuerpo de Cristo, estamos llamados a estar en Comunión con aquellos que comparten este mismo Cuerpo con nosotros.

La asamblea entona entonces juntos el Cordero de Dios, que acompaña una parte muchas veces pasada por alto de la Misa: el Rito de la Fracción. El sacerdote parte su hostia y coloca una pequeña porción en su cáliz, simbolizando la unidad del Cuerpo, la Sangre, el Alma y la Divinidad de Nuestro Señor. Luego, parte su hostia en pedazos más grandes para compartirlas con la asamblea. En los primeros tiempos de la Iglesia, el Papa enviaba a un diácono a compartir partes de la hostia utilizada en su Misa con las parroquias locales de Roma, como signo de la unidad en el culto. De manera semejante, también yo distribuyo a la asamblea una parte de la hostia que usé durante la Misa.

A continuación, el sacerdote eleva la hostia e invita a todos los reunidos que profesan la misma **Fe al Banquete Celestial de Cristo**. Luego, el sacerdote recibe la Comunión, seguido por la asamblea. El ministro de la Comunión muestra la hostia a quienes se acercan a recibir y dice: "El Cuerpo de Cristo", a lo que los fieles responden: "Amén", como afirmación de su fe en que la hostia es verdaderamente el Cuerpo de Cristo. Se le indica al ministro que no utilice nombres individuales en ese momento ("El Cuerpo de Cristo, Daniel", por ejemplo), porque lo que se resalta en ese instante no es nuestra individualidad, sino la unidad en la que todos participamos por el hecho de ser miembros del Cuerpo de Cristo. En ese momento, como nos recuerda la piadosa costumbre, nos convertimos en un sagrario viviente. Por eso, después de recibir la Comunión, no hacemos reverencia ni genuflexión al sagrario, pues llevamos dentro de nosotros al Dios que adoramos.

Habiendo sido alimentados por el mismo Jesús, el sacerdote ofrece la **Oración después de la Comunión**, que resume nuestra oración dominical y pide que la Eucaristía que hemos recibido dé frutos abundantes en nuestra vida. Luego, el sacerdote bendice a los feligreses, y todos son enviados a hacer presente a Jesucristo en el mundo más allá de las puertas de nuestra parroquia. Así, el acto final de la Misa es un recordatorio de que nuestra Fe nunca es algo privado o escondido, sino que está destinada a nutrirnos para ser faros de esperanza en un mundo que tanto anhela esperanza.

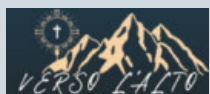

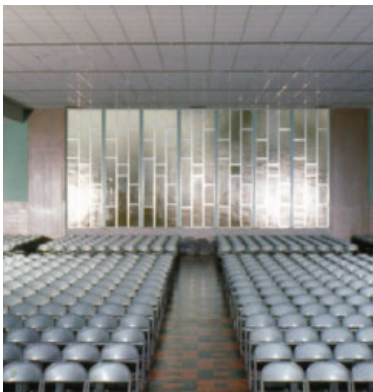
